Pastor Vince's Message

This past month we talked a lot about demons! I let you know that Jesus casting out demons is an important theme in the gospel of Mark; in my first sermon last month I spoke to you about demons in New Testament times and demons today: demons of loneliness and depression, demons of anger and hate, demons of selfishness and self-centeredness. The next week we looked at a passage in Mark 3 when Jesus mentions a sin he calls, "blasphemy of the Holy Spirit," and indicates that this is the worst of all sins. In fact, he says it is unforgiveable. So, what is this sin, and is it really unforgiveable?

This sin of blasphemy against the Holy Spirit is actually very intimately linked with the theme of demons. In fact, Jesus indicates that blasphemy against the Holy Spirit is not being able to recognize demons for what they are: evil. Instead, our culture today teaches us that hatred of one's enemies is good, that helping the less fortunate is bad and only serves to make them lazy, and that the smartest thing we all can do is to look out for our own interests. A giant part of Jesus' mission was to cast out demons, but it was also to send out his disciples to cast out demons. This becomes extremely difficult if we can't recognize them! Further, while God can and does forgive any and every sin, becoming blinded to good and evil is a very difficult sin to forgive because the victims of this sin rarely confess it. Once you stop being able to recognize evil, it's hard to find your way back.

Because our culture seems to glorify evil and foster demons, how do we make sure we don't fall into the trap of blasphemy? This was the topic of my final sermon last month. To make sure we never confuse evil with good and good with evil, we need to make sure we are grounded in rich soil. This can be done through prayer. This can be done through daily devotions and reading the Bible. But this is mostly done through finding a good church and committing ourselves to it. You members of First Christian Church, Greeley, have found a very good church. We are a church that is immersed in the teachings of Christ; we are a church deeply rooted in the love and acceptance of all of our neighbors; we are a church that stands up for the values of God and that decries evil in all forms. So, let us follow the advice of the letter of Hebrews that says "Let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching" (Hebrews 10:24-25).

First Christian Church Greeley (Disciples of Christ) holds Sunday worship services in the sanctuary at 10: 00 am.




\$25,000 from Church savings was transferred to the operating account in July. With this transfer, we will have used \$30,000 of the \$33,446 budgeted.


